



## GPS-tracking, community-based research, and education

Led by ACR Wildlife Ecologist Dr. Quinton Martins, the ACR Mountain Lion Project tracks mountain lions using GPS technology within a study area of approximately 1,000 square miles, primarily in the Mayacamas Mountains (areas east of Hwy 101 and west of Hwy 29) in Sonoma and Napa Counties. The project:

- Identifies priority habitat areas for conservation, and increases understanding of mountain lion ecology and connectivity in this fragmented landscape
- Pairs our research with an extensive education and outreach program that builds on ACR's successful nature education programs. Involves landowners and the community in the research as well as offers ideas on how best to mitigate human-mountain lion conflict.
