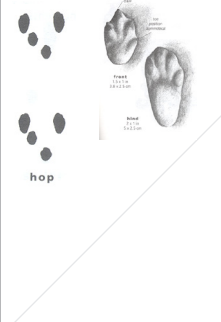


DEER
Odocoileus hemionus
 Food: grass, leaves, acorns, forbs
 Habitat: forest and meadows
 Adaptations: big ears; hoofs for speed
 Lifestyle: Diurnal; live in small herds, a few females and young with a male, or bachelor herds

BRUSH RABBIT



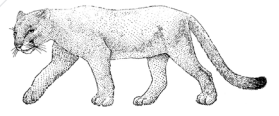
Sylvilagus bachmani
 Food: grass and forbs
 Habitat: thick vegetation, like chaparral
 Adaptations: camouflaged

Lifestyle: Diurnal; always close to brush for safety; live in burrows made by other creatures

Urocyon cinereoargenteus
 Food: omnivores - fruit; small birds and mammals
 Habitat: varied - forest, chaparral and farmlands
 Adaptations: short legs to climb trees
 Lifestyle: Nocturnal; solitary except during denning season



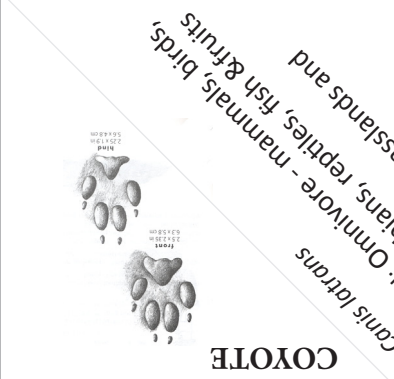
GREY FOX

Puma concolor
 Food: Top predator - prefers deer
 Habitat: Needs tree cover
 Adaptations: night vision; long tail for balance
 Lifestyle: Solitary; very large territories; mainly nocturnal



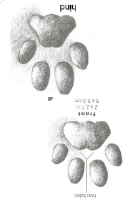
COYOTE

Canis latrans
 Food: Omnivore - mammals, birds, amphibians, reptiles, fish & fruits
 Habitat: Grasslands and farmlands
 Adaptations: long nose for smelling

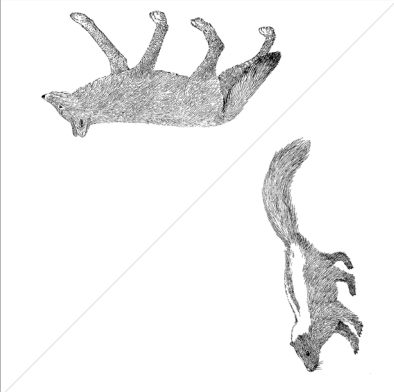
Lifestyle: diurnal
 Social; live alone unless Nocturnal and intelligent
 Adaptations: long sharp digging claws & stinky defense spray

Lynx rufus
 Food: Carnivore - small mammals and birds
 Habitat: Mixed woodlands and farmlands
 Adaptations: Spotted for camouflage; good eyesight
 Lifestyle: Solitary with fairly large territories

BOBCAT



Procyon lotor
 Food: Omnivore - woodland and human, near water
 Habitat: Woodland and human, near water
 Adaptations: dextrous front paws and facial mask
 Lifestyle: nocturnal; den in hollows in trees; excellent climbers; intelligent



STRIPED SKUNK

Mephitis mephitis
 Food: insects, nuts, fish, small vertebrates, fruits, plants, fungi, berries, eggs and carrion
 Habitat: Prefer meadows and woodlands near water
